We are grateful to Inger Davidson for her offer to make a shawl from the yarn donated by the Yarn Co. of Julian. It will undoubtedly be a beaut!

We have a new community project which has been arranged for by Joan Kaye, and Ruby Townsend will chair the project. The PTA of Mission Hills has asked us to teach knitting to children in grades 1-6. This is a sort of 'fill in' for the short fall in the city budget. Can you believe that to economize, the school will have a half day of classes every Tuesday. The PTA is interested in supplementing the school curriculum with both music and arts classes. It would be nice if you can reserve Tuesday afternoons so that if Ruby needs your help you can be available.

If you are making any dolls, children's sweaters or squares for afghan, to be donated to Polinsky Foundation, try to turn them in before the October meeting (10/27/97).

Don't forget, we will have the Carol Lovell workshop on knitting garments that fit October 6, 1997. This will be at the North County Fair Community Room. Details will be provided at the next meeting.

Has anyone started top down raglan sleeve sweater. Joan Kaye gave a good tutorial and pattern at our last meeting, and it should make a great fall sweater. Bring your efforts to the meeting so that we can see how it works out.

The Black Sheep Yarn shop has a new list of classes. We will bring the list to the meeting. Common Threads has also issued a new list of classes for fall. Both of these shops offer excellent classes. If you have the time you really ought to try some.

A question has been raised by the other needlework groups that have participated jointly with us in the past. The feeling has been expressed that because we are such a large group (67 members), and the 3 other groups are so small, we sort of overwhelm the event. All suggestions will be welcome.

Believe it or not, cold weather is on its way. Arlene Pollack was kind enough to come up with this simple pattern for slipper socks which we will share with you.

MATERIALS

Double strand of knitting worsted  
Size 10 ½ needles

Cast on 65 stitches

Knit 12 rows

Row 13: Knit 30, Purl 2 together, Knit 1, Purl 2 together, Knit 30

Row 14: Purl 29, Purl 2 together, Purl 1, Purl 2 together, Purl 29

Row 15: Knit 28, Purl 2 together, Knit 1, Purl 2 together, Knit 28

Continue decreasing until a total of 29 stitches remain.

Drop 1 strand of yarn

Next row: Knit 1, Purl 1 across row

Next row: Purl 1, Knit 1 across row

Repeat the last 2 rows 2 times

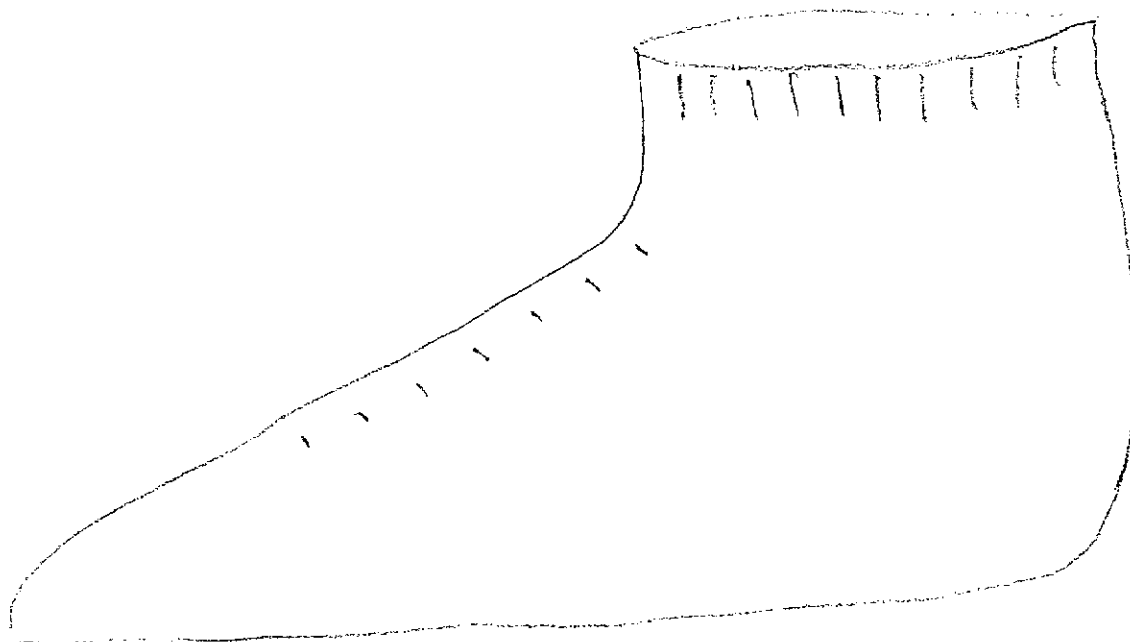
Bind off

Sew back seam from below ribbing

Sew sole together

These directions will fit most women.

Increase or decrease as appropriate for children or men's sizes.



STITCH OF THE MONTH

FARROW RIB

Materials: Worsted yarn, suitable needles for yarn (Size 8 or 9)

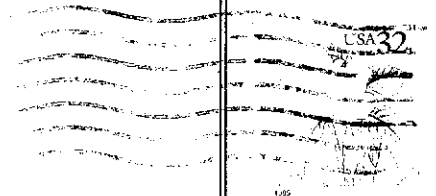
CO 32sts.

Knit 2 Rows

Every row: \*Knit 2, Purl 1\*, repeat to last 2 stitches, Knit 2.

Repeat this row until 2 rows short of 6".

Knit 2 rows to form selvedge.
