The Caryl Lovell workshop on making knitted garments to fit was offered Monday, October 6, 1997. Caryl based her workshop on the Elizabeth Zimmerman method of taking measurements and turning them into an attractive garment. During the course of the workshop, she gave many tips on measuring and finishing. The ratio of shoulders to neck measurement, armseye measurements and how to measure were just a few of the areas covered. Caryl also talked about the measurements used by designers and how they get implemented. It was a very informative and fun class to take.
